CLOSEST TOWN TO THE STUNNING CENTRAL SECTION OF HADRIAN'S WALL WORLD HERITAGE SITE

A town rich in heritage! The area around Haltwhistle's market place has the largest number of surviving bastles in England, and these are marked by plaques so that visitors can follow a 'bastle trail'. One of the most prominent historic buildings is the Centre of Britain Hotel, built as a pele tower in the late 15th century.

Distance from Haltwhistle Station to Haltwhistle Market Place
Walking 0.3miles / 6mins

Your Active Adventure Awaits

Why not explore Hadrian's Wall on bike and foot?

Enjoy a walk from this station, north along Haltwhistle Burn to Hadrian's Wall. Go to the pretty lake at Cawfields Quarry, or further along the waymarked trail to Aesica Roman Fort and the ruins of Thirlwell Castle. You can hire a bicycle, have it delivered to the station and enjoy an adventure on an electric bike.

Walking 2.3miles / 45mins • Cycling 25-35mins

The AD122 Hadrian 's Wall Country Bus makes it easy to explore the area, visit the attractions and enjoy the wonderful scenery, whilst helping the environment. The bus number AD122 reflects the year the Romans started to build the Wall. With a daily service from this station, your bus ticket gives discounts on entrance fees at some attractions.
